In the given quote value and cost are mentioned. These two terms are the main ones when it comes to the short story "The Treasure of Lemon Brown". This story focuses on Greg who runs away because he is angry with his father who wants him to focus more on his studies and less on his basketball games. Greg does not understand that his father loves him a lot and cares about him. He does not understand that his father's love is his treasure.
