Thinking skill I chose: Comparing And Contrasting

ANSWER:

He wants to teach his students to think before doing something and therefore, he does not find physical punishment to be a suitable one. 12. Ben's wife, Christy, tells Ben, "I think you've created a monster." How is this shown in the novel? Give information from the novel to support your answer.

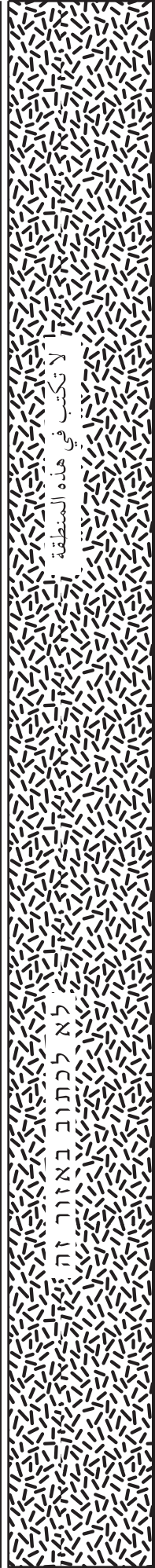
